National Science and Technology Council Taiwan Studies Program: Overview, Guidelines, and Application Process

I. Program objectives

The Taiwan Studies Program (TSP) of the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) aims to support top international universities in dedicating efforts towards Taiwan studies and enhancing the level of research mechanisms. Partnering universities can appoint endowed chairs to integrate Taiwan studies scholars and researchers, expand regional inter-university research communities; or appoint early-career professors to offer Taiwan studies courses and establish research promotion mechanisms; or have veteran scholars serve as research mentors to guide the direction of Taiwan studies and develop potential networks.

II. Grant categories and execution periods

TSP grant applications encompass the following three distinct categories:

1. 國科會臺灣研究捐贈講座教授 NSTC Endowed Chair of Taiwan Studies:

Universities can appoint an endowed chair professor to facilitate integration and enhancement of Taiwan studies research areas. The work shall include (but is not limited to) planning Taiwan studies programs within the university, developing local or regional Taiwan studies academic communities, recruiting full-time researchers, and planning collaborative research with local universities in Taiwan.

Grant applications are open to universities and academy-level institutions by submitting a project proposal. The maximum grant amount available is US\$ 1 million (or the equivalent in local fiat currency). If selected, the institution will receive a one-time payment of the grant amount to establish a permanent fund, and the generated profits and revenues will be utilized to support the program contents. The recipient institution provides matching fund contribution of 50% on a dollar-for-dollar basis to support the project.

2. 國科會臺灣研究新銳教授 NSTC Early Career Scholar (Professor) of Taiwan Studies:

Universities can appoint or recruit full-time professors with academic potential to enhance the university's Taiwan research mechanisms and facilitate more extensive research collaborations by making use of institutional resources. The work shall include (but is not limited to) offering Taiwan studies-related courses, implementing Taiwan studies-related plans, integrating the university's Taiwan studies capabilities, promoting joint research or academic publications with local universities in Taiwan, and cooperating with relevant projects of national ministries and commissions.

Grant applications are open to universities and academy-level institutions by submitting a project proposal. The proposal shall elaborate on the recommended scholar's capabilities in teaching and research related to Taiwan studies, the proportion of time devoted to this project, and plans for follow-up tenured appointment or other long-term contracts after the collaboration period ends. The grant term is 5 years in principle, with an annual cap of US\$ 120,000 or the equivalent in local fiat currency (totaling US\$600,000). The maximum appointment term

may be adjusted in accordance with institutional promotion rules as announced by the university. If selected, the institution will receive annual disbursements of up to the annual capped amount.

3. 國科會臺灣研究導師 NSTC Mentorship of Taiwan Studies:

Universities can recruit veteran professors or researchers with outstanding academic achievements related to East Asian and Taiwan studies to guide the development direction of Taiwan studies. The work shall include (but is not limited to) instructing young scholars, organizing academic conferences and community activities on Taiwan studies, and facilitating regional or international academic cooperation channels.

Grant applications are open to the senior scholars themselves, or recommended by NSTC overseas offices or professors in related fields in Taiwan before the candidates submit the application. The maximum grant term is 2 years, with a total budget cap of US\$ 20,000 (or the equivalent in local fiat currency). If selected, the institution employing the senior scholar will receive the grant amount in one or multiple installments.

III. Eligibility and application procedure

1. Eligibility:

Universities from all countries (with a priority for Europe and the US) that have ranked within the top 1,000 in the QS World University Rankings or the top 500 in the field of humanities and social sciences in the recent three years are eligible to apply. Other research institutions deemed eligible by this program are also welcome to apply. Institutions with (but not limited to) expertise in Chinese studies, East Asian studies, politics, history, culture, and other Taiwan-related humanities and social science fields are highly preferred.

2. Application procedure:

NSTC Endowed Chair of Taiwan Studies

- (1) Application form (refer to Attachment 1 for more details)
 - A. Candidate description:

This section should include the individual's educational background, professional expertise, research accomplishments, and teaching experience and should emphasize their research experience and achievements with respect to Taiwan-related topics.

B. Information on the applying organization:

collaborative research, and international collaboration accomplishments.

C. Collaborative project:

D. Budget proposal:

For the organizational information form and budget proposal, the applying organization may either use the templates provided on the TSP's official website or use their own forms, provided that all required information (as specified in the templates) is included.

- (2) Curriculum vitae of the principal investigator
- (3) Salary reference information for the candidate (or equivalent level) provided by the applying organization
- (4) Letter of consent from the dean of the college regarding the establishment of the course.
- (5) Other documents or information that would be helpful in the review process

NSTC Early-Career Scholar/Professor of Taiwan Studies

- (1) Application form (refer to Attachment 2 for more details)
 - A. Candidate or job description:

This section should include the individual's educational background, professional expertise, research accomplishments, and teaching experience and emphasize their research experience and achievements with respect to Taiwan-related topics. Provide a detailed description of their job duties and the candidates' qualifications.

B. Teaching and research proposal:

Provide a complete outline for the curriculum and research. If a department has yet to appoint faculty, the department should explain its plan for recruiting candidates for the position and how the to-be-created position will contribute to the achievement of specific goals.

- C. Information on the applying organization:
 - List the applying organization's achievements and current state with respect to Taiwan-related research, including the existing curriculum structure and organizational members.
- D. Collaborative project:

Describe the goals of the collaborative project, including

the relationships between the candidates recruited for the position and existing organization, potential collaboration opportunities for enhancing interorganizational connections, and plans for long-term appointments beyond the collaboration period.

E. Budget proposal:

For the organizational information form and budget proposal, the applying organization may either use the templates provided on the TSP's official website or use their own forms, provided that all required information (as specified in the templates) is included.

- (4) Letter of consent from the dean of the college regarding the establishment of the course.

NSTC Mentorship of Taiwan Studies

(1) Application form (refer to Attachment 3 for more details)

A. Candidate description:

This section should include the individual's educational background, professional expertise, research accomplishments, and teaching experience and emphasize their research experience and achievements with respect to Taiwan-related topics.

B. Collaboration and networking plans:

Please provide an estimate for the duration of the plan and identify universities and potential partners for the promotion of Taiwan studies.

C. Budget proposal:

The applying organization may either use the template provided on the TSP's official website or use their own forms, provided that all required information is included (as specified in the template).

IV. Application Period

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Applying organizations shall be notified individually of the review results within 3 months of the receipt of the application. If necessary, extensions may be granted.

V. Notices

- 1. All applications and grant items under this program must be reviewed and approved by the committee organized by the NSTC and subsequently announced. Once a collaborative project is established, the Science and Technology Policy Research and Information Center (STPI) of the National Applied Research Laboratories (NARLabs) will represent the executing unit in signing a contract with the collaborating institution. The rights and obligations of both parties will be primarily based on the terms stipulated in the contract, with detailed provisions on the collaborating institution's tasks, assessments, and grant disbursement methods.
- 2. For approved applications, if the collaborating institution wishes to adjust or change the implementation details during the execution period, including project extensions or terminations, they must immediately notify the program office. If necessary, this program may request the collaborating institution to adjust the content of the project.
- 3. Scholars receiving grants under this program who are found to have violated academic ethics must be promptly reported by the collaborating institution to the executing unit of this program. If the institution's academic review committee determines a violation of academic ethics, the scholar may be required to return the

- received grant, depending on the severity of the violation.
- 4. If vacancies arise for any positions during the execution period due to various factors, the institution must submit a proposal for a new appointee upon becoming aware of the vacancy. Detailed regulations on this matter are specified in the contract.
- 5. If a consensus on the implementation details cannot be reached between the collaborating institution and this program, the institution may be asked to make improvements within a specified period. If necessary, grant support may also be terminated.
- 6. Collaborating institutions must submit an annual progress report detailing substantial achievements and the status of fund utilization (the funds should be verified by the institution's accounting unit).
